

**GCN 2018  
CHILDREN'S MOVEMENT WORKSHOP  
AND VOCAL/DRAMATIC AUDITION INFORMATION**

In GCN 201, **Angels and Kings**, Children in the 2nd - 5th grades who are in weKIDS Choir may participate in the GCN Kids Scene without audition. There also will be opportunities for children, ages 1<sup>st</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> grades to perform in specialty vocal, dramatic roles and dance roles. Children who want to participate in any scene whatsoever in addition to the GCN Kids Scene and/or the Family Friendly Nativity scene (with their parent/grandparent) **must audition**. Kids Vocal/Dramatic Auditions will be held Saturday, September 8 at 9-9:45 followed by a Dance Workshop (9:45-10:30). Children should plan to stay for the entire audition time. 2nd -5th grade **Child Tappers** with at least one year of tap experience should come (with their tap shoes) on Sunday, September 9, 7:30-8:15 for a Tap Audition. Audition is required even for scenes that are listed as "All Cast/No Audition" scenes for adults. Participation in weKIDS Choir is a pre-requisite for performance in any Children's Specialty role.

FORMS REQUIRED (all available at gloriouschristmasnights.com)

- a completed Children's Vocal/Dramatic Audition Form;
- an Avoid Calendar Form filled in with concrete, inflexible avoid dates (please see back of Audition Form for additional details); and
- a Participation Form – if not previously turned in

Children are encouraged to prepare one of these songs for audition. A child may do a different (appropriate) song, but singing time should be kept to under 1 minute.
